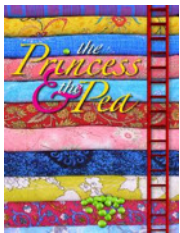

Sometimes the smallest things cause the biggest problems...

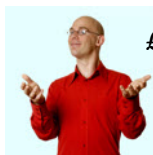

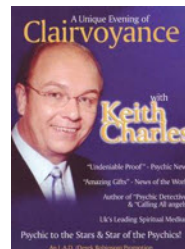
