1	Norman Cross Trust	£500.00	To support Napoleonic Re-enactment on July 20 <sup>th</sup> , 2019, organised by National organisation the Napoleonic Association.
2	Huntingdonshire History Festival	£500.00	The grant will go towards three children events, including two arts & crafts activities based on history and one writer-active event.
3	Huntingdon Volunteer Centre	£500.00	To purchase two new laptops, one for use by Huntingdon Volunteer Centre, one for use by Huntingdon Together charity shop.

In order to do this, we need to improve awareness of our service amongst GPs in Huntingdonshire. The grant will go towards literature for GP's to support the referral process.
7	Huntingdonshire Association for Community Travel (HACT)	£500.00	To provide members of HACT with a summer day trip.
8	Huntingdon Library	£500.00	The Summer Reading Challenge is a national scheme run by The Reading Agency. The aim is to inspire children to develop a love of reading and continue with their literary development. The grant will go towards visits of library staff to local primary schools to promote the scheme and encourage participation. This includes schools based in Huntingdonshire as well as secondary schools to encourage children ages 12-16 to volunteer.
